The Archbishop of Toronto elevated to the College of Cardinals

OTTAWA, 6 October, 2024 — Today, Pope Francis announced a Consistory for the creation of 20 new Cardinals from around the world to be held in Vatican City on 8 December 2024 (Feast of the Immaculate Conception). The Most Reverend Francis Leo, Archbishop of Toronto, is among those who will be elevated to the College of Cardinals and will become the 18th Cardinal in the history of the Catholic Church in Canada. With this appointment, Canada will now have five Cardinals, with the four others being: His Eminence Gérald Cyprien Cardinal Lacroix, Archbishop of Quebec and Primate of Canada, His Eminence Thomas Cardinal Collins, Archbishop Emeritus of Toronto, His Eminence Marc Cardinal Ouellet, Archbishop Emeritus of Quebec and Prefect Emeritus of the Dicastery for Bishops, and His Eminence Michael F. Cardinal Czerny, S.J., Prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development.

Cardinal-elected Francis Leo was born in Montreal in 1971. He began his journey into the priesthood by enrolling at the Grand Séminaire de Montréal in 1990 and was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese on 14 December 1996. Following his ordination, he served in various parishes in Montreal until 2006, when he was invited to study at the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy in Rome. This led him to the Diplomatic Service of the Holy See where he worked in various Apostolic Nunciatures across the world from 2006 to 2012. In January 2012, Pope Benedict XVI honored him with the title of Monsignor and appointed him as Chaplain of His Holiness.

Cardinal-elect Leo taught theology and philosophy at the Grand Séminaire de Montréal, and provided spiritual guidance to seminarians. In 2015, he became the General Secretary of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), a role he held until 2021.

On 1 February 2022, he was appointed Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia for the Archdiocese of Montreal. On 16 July 2022, Pope Francis appointed him Auxiliary Bishop of Montreal, and his episcopal ordination took place on 12 September 2022. He became the Archbishop of Toronto on 11 February 2023.

Cardinal-elect Leo holds advanced degrees in Canon Law from Lateran University, Diplomacy and International Law, and a Doctorate in Systematic Theology from the University of Dayton/IMRI, specializing in Mariology. He also has a Licentiate in Philosophy, a Diploma in Classical Studies from the Université de Montréal, and a Graduate Certificate in Spiritual Direction from the Aquinas Institute of Theology. His teaching experience spans several countries, including Canada, Australia, and the United States.

TO PRESIDENTS OF ECUMENICAL COMMISSIONS OF EPISCOPAL CONFERENCES

Dear Brother in Christ,

It is my pleasure to write to you regarding the **2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**. You will find enclosed the original English text, together with French, Portuguese and Spanish translations of the material for 2025. In the coming weeks, versions in other languages will also be available on the DPCU website (www.christianunity.va).

The theme of the 2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is based on a text from the Gospel of St John: “Do you believe this” (John 11:26). The prayers and reflections were prepared by the brothers and sisters of the monastic community of Bose in northern Italy. As usual, an international team appointed jointly by the DPCU and the Faith and Order Commission of the WCC worked with the drafters to finalise the materials.

As you will know, 2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the first Ecumenical Council. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the Creed formulated during this Council. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 offers an invitation to draw on this shared heritage and to enter more deeply into the faith that unites all Christians. Let us pray that the grace we implore as Catholics during the Jubilee year will also be poured out in our ecumenical endeavours, giving new impetus to the paths of reconciliation between all believers in Christ.

The materials include an introduction to the theme, an ecumenical worship service, a selection of short readings and prayers for each day of the week. Because of the ecumenical significance of the year 2025, short patristic texts, mostly dating from the first millennium, were also included, in order to provide an insight into Christian reflection at that time, and to help situate the Council of Nicaea’s definitions in the contexts that gave rise to them and those that were influenced by them. The resources can be drawn upon in many ways, and are intended for use not only during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, but throughout 2025.

The DPCU requests that you bring these resources to the attention of those responsible for coordinating Week of Prayer for Christian Unity events. We strongly encourage regional or local adaptation of the material, so that it may effectively address the local religious, social and cultural context. It is also hoped that the material will be adapted and made available to groups and associations of young people. This process will provide a further valuable opportunity for collaboration between Christians at the local level.

**Statement by the Most Rev. William T. McGrattan,
Bishop of Calgary and CCCB President,
to the Catholic Faithful in Canada,
inviting them to pray and fast for peace**

During this month of October dedicated to Mary, and especially today on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, at a time when there continues to be so much violence between peoples and nations in the Middle East (and elsewhere), I invite all Catholics in Canada to take up Pope Francis' invitation to pray and fast for peace.

Prayer is a most powerful instrument, capable of healing division, changing hearts, opening minds, and bringing new beginnings to situations which seem impossible. Mary, who bears the title Queen of Peace, is a powerful intercessor who, likewise desiring peace among all peoples and nations, brings our prayers and petitions to God and makes them more effective.

Fasting, in this context, provides a special way by which to join ourselves to the suffering of others, in solidarity with them, as well as to the sufferings endured by Christ during his Passion and Crucifixion. We may think, as we fast, of the many forms of human suffering that are associated with war and all forms of violence, and thereby strengthen the earnestness and concreteness of our prayers.

As we pray and fast for peace, let us also seek in our own lives to become instruments of peace wherever we live, taking inspiration from the beautiful and famous poem of Saint Francis of Assisi, "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace." It is in welcoming dialogue, embracing forgiveness, and supporting efforts to foster justice and reconciliation, that such steps help to create a society where all people can flourish in the way that God intended.

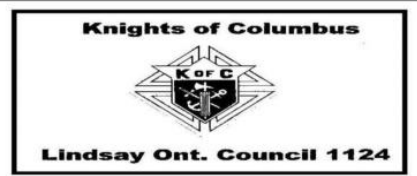
